



International Roadcheck 2019


The Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance's (CVSA) International Roadcheck will take place June 4-6, 2019. Over that 72-hour period, commercial motor vehicle inspectors in jurisdictions throughout North America will conduct inspections on commercial motor vehicles and drivers.

Each year, International Roadcheck places special emphasis on a category of violations. This year's focus is steering and suspension systems. While checking vehicle compliance is always part of the North American Standard Inspection Program, CVSA is highlighting steering components and suspension systems this year as a reminder of their importance to highway safety.

CVSA has a flyer available that describes the importance of steering and suspension systems and ways to identify issues. It also outlines what inspectors look for during the inspection of the steering mechanism and the suspension components. Check it out here:
