




Preventing Winter Fires

With half of all home heating fires occurring in December, January, and February, stay safe this winter with these tips from the U.S. Fire Administration:

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space heaters.
- Keep portable generators outside, away from windows, and as far away from your home as possible.
- Install and test carbon monoxide alarms at least once a month.
- Plug only one heat-producing appliance (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.
- Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents every year.
- Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it outside at least 10 feet from your home and any nearby buildings.

Responsible Appliance Disposal Programs

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) Responsible Appliance Disposal (RAD) program is a partnership launched in October 2006 to protect the ozone layer, cut greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, and benefit communities.

RAD partners collect used refrigerated appliances from consumers including refrigerators, freezers, window air conditioners, and dehumidifiers. RAD partners work with recyclers to ensure the used appliances are disposed of using best environmental practices.
