



Operation Safe Driver Week

This year's Operation Safe Driver Week will take place July 11-17. Throughout the week, law enforcement personnel will be on the lookout for commercial motor vehicle drivers and passenger vehicle drivers engaging in risky driving behaviors in or around a commercial motor vehicle. The Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance (CVSA) selected speeding as its focus this year because despite a drop in roadway travel last year due to the pandemic; nationally, traffic fatalities increased.

CVSA's Operation Safe Driver Program aims to improve the behavior of all drivers operating in an unsafe manner – either in or around commercial motor vehicles – through educational and traffic enforcement strategies. - Step on the lawn, and if the grass springs back, it doesn't need water.
- Raise your lawn mower blade. Longer grass promotes a more drought-resistant lawn, reduced evaporation, and fewer weeds.
- Sweep driveways, sidewalks, and steps rather than hosing them off.
- Plan to water in the early morning or evening to beat daytime evaporation.
- Inspect irrigation systems and fix leaks and broken or clogged sprinkler heads.
