## Backyard Composting

There are many different ways to make a compost pile. EPA.gov lists the following tips when making a compost pile in your backyard. They advise that regular mixing or turning of the compost and some water will help maintain the compost.

- Select a dry, shady spot near a water source for your compost pile or bin.
- Add brown and green materials as they are collected, making sure larger pieces are chopped or shredded.
- Moisten dry materials as they are added.
- Once your compost pile is established, mix grass clippings and green waste into the pile and bury fruit and vegetable waste under 10 inches of compost material.
- Optional: Cover top of compost with a tarp to keep it moist. When the material at the bottom is dark and rich in color, your compost is ready to use. This usually takes anywhere between two months to two years.

## Call 811 Before You Dig

Are you planning to build a shed or install a fence this spring? If so, call 811 a few days before you start any digging project to protect yourself and others from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines. They recommend that you follow the 811 process below:

- **Notify** your local one-call center by calling 811 or making an online request 2-3 days before work begins. Be sure to check their state map to find out how far in advance you need to call. The one-call center will transmit information to the affected utility operators.
- **Wait** the required amount of time for affected utility operators to respond to your request.
- **Confirm** that all affected utility operators have responded to your request and marked underground utilities. You can do this by comparing the marks to the list of utilities the one-call center notified.
- **Respect** the marks.
- **Dig Carefully** around the marks with care.
