Steps of Sanitation

If your company has a food manufacturing facility, it is important to keep it sanitized to ensure freedom from disease and contaminants while maintaining a clean work environment for employees.

To ensure you are sanitizing correctly, follow these steps below:

1. Remove waste materials
2. Wrap electric
3. Pre-rinse
4. Wash and scrub
5. Rinse
6. Inspect
7. Sanitize
8. Remove excess moisture

Using a Fire Extinguisher

Would you know how to use a fire extinguisher if needed? Most operate using the following P.A.S.S. technique found on www.osha.gov:

PULL: Pull the pin. This will also break the tamper seal.

AIM: Aim low, pointing the extinguisher nozzle (or its horn or hose) at the base of the fire. (NOTE: Do not touch the plastic discharge horn on CO2 extinguishers, it gets very cold and may damage skin.)

SQUEEZE: Squeeze the handle to release the extinguishing agent.

SWEEP: Sweep from side to side at the base of the fire until it appears to be out. Watch the area. If the fire re-ignites, repeat steps 2 - 4.

If you have the slightest doubt about your ability to fight a fire, you should evacuate immediately.
